VINTAGE BLEND

They represented the Far Western District last July in Miami Beach at the International Quartet competition. Then last October they competed and

won the Far Western District Championship!

The name of this quartet really tells the story . . . a smooth mellow "Vintage Blend" that recalls the days when barbershop quartets were all the rage. The quartet members' experience is vast.
